About Santipur College

Santipur College, a highly regarded institution of higher education in Nadia district, was established on **July 22**, **1948**. Founded by notable educationists from Santipur, spearheaded by then M.P. Pandit Laxmi Kanta Maitra, the college began in Mr. Atal Bihari Maitra's Kharjala Garden House. Initially affiliated with the University of Calcutta, it has been affiliated with the **University of Kalyani since 2000**. Recognized by the **UGC** under sections 2(f) and 12(B), Santipur College was first accredited by **NAAC in March 2007** followed by NAAC accreditation (2nd cycle) on March 16, 2021 that valid until March 15, 2026. Starting with just 48 students in a two-story building on 47 acres, the college has significantly expanded, now offering higher education in **Science, Arts, and Commerce**. In the 2014-2015 sessions, 15 departments served 4,690 students. The college boasts highly qualified staff, with students pursuing Major under NEP in 11 subjects with a Major in Computer Application. It also features **NCC units** (for boys and girls, with a firing range), an **NSS unit**, a Gymnasium, a large playground, an Open-air Theater, and a substantial garden. Additionally, a **Netaji Subhas Open University study center**, established in 2004, currently serves a number of students across various courses.

NORMS OF ADMISSION

1. A candidate may be admitted to the first semester of 4-year (8 Semester) B.A./B.Com./B.Sc. courses of studies on passing Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination in General conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination conducted by other State Board/Council, orThe W.B. Council of Rabindra Open Schooling, or The National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) recognized by the Distance Education Bureau (DEB) subject to fulfillment of the conditions mentioned below:

In case of other Boards/Councils, a candidate shall have to pass in five recognized subjects, of which one shall be English, of full marks not being less than 100 each. A candidate passing in four subjects shall not be eligible for admission.

However, candidates passing Higher Secondary examination from vocational stream conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Technical & Vocational Education & Skill Development (WBSCTVE & SD) or any other equivalent Board/Council are eligible for admission provided that the candidate must have passed in 5 (five) recognized subjects of which one shall be English in the previous qualifying examination.

2. Candidates shall be allowed for admission within 03 (three) consecutive academic sessions including the year of passing the previous qualifying examination. (For example, candidates passing H.S. Examination in the year 2021 will get last chance of admission in the academic session 2024-2025.)

3. Programmes of Study:

There shall be following one type of Under-Graduate Programme-

- (I) 4-Year UG Degree (Honours/Honours with Research)
- (II) As per the Curriculum and Credit Framework for Under-graduate Programmes, developed by the UGC there will be provisions for awarding UG Certificate, UG Diploma and Basic UG Degree with Major. Separate Rules/Guidelines will be framed in this regard.
- (III) For 4 year UG Degree (Honours with Research), a student can choose a research stream in the fourth year, subject to fulfillment of all conditions; laid down by the UGC for implementation of NEP and Curriculum Credit Framework

Major students not undertaking research will take 3 courses for 12 credits in lieu of research project/dissertation 4. Minimum Eligibility Criteria for Admission:

1. 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research): A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent Examination from other recognized Boards/Councils with at least four subject including English as

- Compulsory Subject of 100 marks is eligible to take admission to the UG-Courses of studies on the basis of merit and available vacancy of the particular subject(s).
- 2. Aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top- four subjects, including Marks obtained in English, in order of marks secured by a candidate. Marks obtained in Compulsory Environmental Studies (if any) shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks.
- 3. A candidate shall be allowed to pursue any one of the Programme in a particular Academic Session. At the initial stage, every student has to choose one Major subject and two Minor subjects.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 1. Students are admitted to the college strictly on the basis of merit. A merit list is prepared on the basis of marks obtained in top-four subjects in the (10+2) Level Examination. The admission process starts as per the notification of the University of Kalyani and WBHED after the declaration of Class XII results of major National Boards and West Bengal Board.
- 2. Admission to 4YearB.A./B.Com./B.Sc. degree courses for the Session 2025-2026 will be done through On-line process and the admission will be on the basis of the marks obtained in Higher Secondary or equivalent examination recognized by University of Kalyani and other criteria as stated by the University. Notification of admission is made after publication of Higher Secondary or Equivalent examination results of West Bengal and following the Govt. Order No.: 266(31)-Edn(U)-EH/1U-45/2020(Pt.), Dated: 17.03.2023, No.:339- Edn(CS)/OM74L/2023, Dated: 2605.2023 and 354-Edn(CS)/10M-95/14, Dated:02.06.2023.
- a) As soon as the applicants notified (through SMS or College website) that admission has been offered to him/her, the requisite admission fees will have to be paid on the day within stipulated time through Bank, otherwise the offer of admission is liable to be cancelled. No physical presence is required at the College.
- b) The registration must be done within one month on the date of admission; otherwise, admission will be treated as canceled. 75% class attendance must be required for that period.
- 4. All admission is valid for one semester (Six Months) only and therefore it must be renewed at the end of every semester.
- 5. Fees once paid will not be carried over for a further session.
- 6. Document verification: Verification of documents, if required, would be done only when the students report for the classes in due course. Admission will be cancelled if the documents are found not in conformity with the declaration in the forms submitted on-line.
- 7. Documents required at the time of verification (if necessary) are:
 - a) Print-out of the Application form (One copy).
 - b) Original Payment-slip / Bank Challan and its photocopy.
 - c) Original migration certificate and its photocopy (only for migrating students)
 - d) Original mark sheet of H.S. or equivalent examination and its photocopy
 - e) Original admit card of Madhyamik Examination and its photocopy
 - f) One copy stamp size colored photograph
 - g) Original SC/ST /Physically Challenged/Sports Quota (if any) certificate and its photocopy. *Certificate from either D.M. /S.D.O. only valid for SC/ST candidates*.
 - h) Original School leaving certificate.
- 8. Applicants for 1st Semester admission are requested to visit our college website every moment for any update regarding the admission process.

In exercise of the power conferred by clause (g) of sub section (1) of section 26 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, the University Grants Commission hear by makes the some regulations called the "UGC Regulations on Curving the Menace of Ragging in Higher Education Institutions, 2009". It shall come into force with immediate effect to all the universities established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, a Provincial Act or a State Act, to all Institutions deemed to be universities under section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, to all other higher educational institutions. Including the departments, constituent units and all the premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen etc.) of such Universities / deemed universities and other higher educational institutions, whether located within the campus or outside, and to all means of transportation of students whether public or private. Infrastructure & Resources

The College Buildings and Seminar Halls: College is divided into five segments i) a three-storied building containing the English dept. on the ground floor, Commerce, Economics and Computer Science dept., The NSOU study centre is on the first floor. The central library is on the second floor. ii) single-storied building where Zoology and Botany departments are situated. iii) a two-storied building, on the ground floor, we have the Philosophy dept. and the KU, DODL study centre. On the first floor, we have Bengali, Sanskrit and History departments. A smart classroom and a digital classroom are also present on this floor. iv) Science Block contains Physics and Chemistry departments, and v) the building of the Mathematics department.

The college has an NCC unit (for both boys and girls) with a firing range, an NSS unit, a gymnasium, a vast playground, an open-air theatre, and a huge garden consisting of several teak and mango trees. There is a study centre of Netaji Subhas Open University on the college campus, which has been operational since 2004 and currently accommodates around 200 students pursuing courses such as P.G., U.G., BLIS, and BPP.

Laboratories:

Departments like Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology, Botany, Computer Application. Already we have well-equipped and modernized laboratories, which are also updated as per the new CBCS syllabus with RUSA 2.0 grant. Students are groomed by the expert teachers to have an individual hands-on-experience.

Library:

The Central Library currently houses 28,384 books, including textbooks and reference materials, alongside newspapers, journals, and periodicals with updated information. Thanks to a recent donation of approximately ₹1 lakh from State Bank of India, Santipur, and the purchase of numerous books aligning with the new CBCS syllabus, the collection continues to grow. The implementation of the INFLIBNET facility through the N-List program has further enhanced the library, providing easy access to a vast collection of e-journals and e-books, greatly benefiting students.

The library operates from 10:30 AM to 4:30 PM, Monday through Friday, and from 10:30 AM to 1:30 PM on Saturdays. Students can borrow books using their library cards. In addition to the main collection, the library also features a reading section and various departmental libraries that operate with limited capacity to further support students.

24 Hours CCTV:

For the surveillance of 24x7, there are forty three (46) CCTVs at present in the college campus among them twenty three (23) cameras recorded live, which are installed covering almost all corners of the college. The CCTV footage helps the college administration to provide a safe and secured college life to the students and staff.

Rainwater harvesting:

A rainwater reservoir facility was established in March 2019, on the backside of the science block, where three water reservoirs are present. In this facility, rainwater comes from the rooftop of the science block and is stored in these reservoirs. We use this water mainly for gardening purposes.

Medicinal plant garden:

A medicinal plant garden is present beside the old heritage classroom building, with more than thirty medicinal plants are present including Ashwagandha, Tulsi, Amla, Turmeric, and Giloy etc. We are working on opening another medicinal plant garden in front of the Botany department.

Students Benefit and Support System

- ❖ Scholarships: Our college is committed to supporting students through various financial aid programs. We provide free-studentships to a substantial number of economically challenged yet regular and meritorious students, with active assistance from the Students' Union in their disbursement. Beyond this, students from Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST), Other Backward Classes (OBC), and Minority communities can avail themselves of stipends allocated by both the Government of West Bengal and the Government of India. Furthermore, female students who fulfill the State Government's specified norms are eligible for Kanyashree stipends. WBSCC:In 2021, the Higher Education Department of West Bengal has launched a new project called "Student Credit Card Scheme (WBSCC) to support the students to pursue their undergraduate and other different level of studies in different level of studies without feeling any financial constraints. The students can avail the facility of borrowing a certain amount of loan for continuing their studies in different courses under this scheme in Santipur College also. - ❖ Tutorial Classes for Doubt clearing: In addition to the standard timetable, departments organize regular tutorial classes, particularly for major students.
